

Old Fort Niagara is a not-for-profit organization that relies heavily on admission fees and museum shop sales to maintain and operate the site. The continued health of the Old Fort Niagara Association thus depends on a steady flow of visitors to the site.

The Robert Moses Parkway is the primary transportation artery connecting Old Fort Niagara with Niagara Falls and the Niagara River Corridor. The Parkway provides visitors with a quick and easy path of travel directly to the Fort's gates. Visitors frequently inquire about the travel time between Niagara Falls and Old Fort Niagara and react favorably when told that the Parkway facilitates the trip in twenty minutes.

Positive developments along the northern end of the Niagara River waterfront will only draw more visitors to the area in the future. Complete removal of the Parkway would impede access to Old Fort Niagara and result in a serious loss of business. The Old Fort Niagara Association expresses its strong opposition to the complete removal of the Robert Moses Parkway.
